

Gospel of John

(14.8; #52) The Promise of the Spirit of Truth

John 14:8-17 ESV

Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." 9 Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves. 12 "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father. 13 Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14 If you ask me anything in my name, I will do it. 15 "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. 16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, 17 even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

Jesus clearly teaches the Trinity...John 14:8-17

What is Philip's request? **14:8; Mt.5:8; Rev.22:3-5**

And Jesus' initial reply? **14:9, 12:45; Col.1:15; Heb.1:3; see 1Cor.15:12**

What does Jesus next remind Philip regarding His teaching? **14:10, 10:30, 38 see 17:21-23**

What is the 'alternate' for those who can't believe this truth? **14:11, 10:37-39; Lu.7:18-23**

And what about us today who have never seen Him (physically)? **1Peter 1:8-9**

What is the first astounding promise He gives? **14:12a, 13:16 Acts 3:6-8, 5:1-16, 8:4-8, 9:36-43**

And what is the second astounding promise? **14:12b; Acts 2:37-47, 28:23-29; Heb.2:3-4**

How does Jesus instruct them about requests? **14:13a, 16:23-28 Why? 1:13b; 1Jn.5:14-15**

How is the emphasized? **14:14; 1Jn.5:14-15**

What are the 'boundaries' for this promise? **1Jn.5:14-15; James 1:5-8; Judg.6:37-40**

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Jesus clearly teaches the Trinity...John 14:8-17

What is Philip's request? **14:8; Mt.5:8; Rev.22:3-5**

Lord, show (deiknuo= literally or figuratively), and it is enough (sufficient, be content).

And Jesus' initial reply? **14:9, 12:45; Col.1:15; Heb.1:3; see 1Cor.15:12**

I've been with you so long and still do not know (ginosko) Me? Show (deiknuo) Father?

What does Jesus next remind Philip regarding His teaching? **14:10, 10:30, 38 see 17:21-23**

Don't you believe that I am in the Father and He is in Me? My words are from the Father.

What is the 'alternate' for those who can't believe this truth? **14:11, 10:37-39; Lu.7:18-23**

Believe that I am in the Father and He is in Me or else believe on account of the works...!

And what about us today who have never seen Him (physically)? **1Peter 1:8-9**

What is the first astounding promise He gives? **14:12a, 13:16 Acts 3:6-8, 5:1-16, 8:4-8, 9:36-43**

Whoever believes in Me will also do the works that I do! This is not in quality, but scope.

And what is the second astounding promise? **14:12b; Acts 2:37-47, 28:23-29; Heb.2:3-4**

And even greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father! Scope...

How does Jesus instruct them about requests? **14:13a, 16:23-28 Why? 1:13b; 1Jn.5:14-15**

Ask in My (Jesus) name, I will do it! This is so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

How is the emphasized? **14:14; 1Jn.5:14-15**

To ask 'anything in My name' means asking according to His nature, His will, His glory.

What are the 'boundaries' for this promise? **1Jn.5:14-15; James 1:5-8; Judg.6:37-40**

Asking must be according to His will. Not frivolous self-interests. Not a 'magic wand'!
