(17.11; #65) The Divine Transition

John 17:11-19 ESV

11 And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. 12 While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. 13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. 14 I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 15 I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. 16 They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. 18 As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. 19 And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

From **17:12**, what is clear about the meaning of Jesus *kept, guarded them*? **17:12, 17:15**

What does Jesus now request, in the hearing of the disciples? **17:13, 16:22-24; Gal.5:22**

What had Jesus given them? **17:14a, 17:8** and the result? **17:14b; 15:18-21; Mt.10:24-25**

What is Jesus not asking the Father to do for His disciples? **17:15a; Phil.1:20-26**

Instead, Jesus is asking the Father for what? **17:15b; Mt.6:13; IITim.4:1-8; Job 1:6-10**

They are not of the world, as I am not of the world (**17:16**), please do what? **17:17; Ps.119:151**

As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. Therefore I do what? **17:18-19**

What does Jesus request of the Father since He is leaving the world? 17:11, 14:20-21

Father, keep them in Your name, which you have given Me, that they may be one, like Us.

What does Jesus now declare about them, while He was with them? 17:12, 6:70; Ps.41:9

I kept them in Your name which You gave me. I guarded them. Not one lost but Judas...

From 17:12, what is clear about the meaning of Jesus *kept, guarded them*? 17:12, 17:15

Jesus is clearly talking about their eternal life. He guarded (protected) them from Satan.

What does Jesus now request, in the hearing of the disciples? 17:13, 16:22-24; Gal.5:22

Now I am coming to You. I speak these things in the world, that they may have My joy!

What had Jesus given them? 17:14a, 17:8 and the result? 17:14b; 15:18-21; Mt.10:24-25

Jesus had given them the Father's Word. And the world hated them; not of the world...

What is Jesus not asking the Father to do for His disciples? 17:15a; Phil.1:20-26

Jesus is not asking that the disciples be taken out of the (hostile) world. Remove hatred.

Instead, Jesus is asking the Father for what? 17:15b; Mt.6:13; IITim.4:1-8; Job 1:6-10

He is asking the Father to keep them (watch, guard) from (out of the power of) the evil one

They are not of the world, as I am not of the world (17:16), please do what? 17:17; Ps.119:151

Please sanctify them (make Holy, set apart) by/in the Truth. Your Word is Truth.

As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world. Therefore I do what? 17:18-19

I consecrate myself (set apart for sacrifice), so that they may be set apart in Truth!
