

Gospel of John

(19.10; #72) The Crucifixion

John 19:10-18 ESV

10 So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?" 11 *Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above. Therefore he who delivered me over to you has the greater sin."*

12 From then on Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend. Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar." 13 So when Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called The Stone Pavement, and in Aramaic Gabbatha. 14 Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" 15 They cried out, "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." 16 So he delivered him over to them to be crucified.

So they took Jesus, 17 and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. 18 There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them.

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The crucifixion verdict...19:10-18

You would have no authority over Me at all unless given you from above. Jews/greater sin.

From fear, what does Pilate try to do then? [19:12a; Mt.27:22-23; Mk.15:8-14; Lu.23:20-23](#)

He attempted to release Jesus. This is recorded by each of the (4) Gospel writers.

With a riot in the making, what do the Jews finally charge Pilate that persuades him? [19:12](#)

You are not Caesar's friend if you release one claiming to be a king. Don't release Him!

What does [19:13](#) reveal is really Pilate's concern? (more than Jesus, Jews, riots, etc.)

History confirms his prior mishandling of Jews put him at odds w/Caesar. Could be fatal!

In his official judgment seat, Pilate presents the scourged Jesus. Result? [19:14-16; Mt.27:26-31](#)

Despite his last attempt to release Him (19:15), he delivers Him to be crucified.

How does Isaiah describe Him at this point? [Is.52:13-15, 53:3-7](#)

He was marred more than any man. Men hide their face. Despised, crushed for our sins...

Where was Jesus taken for the crucifixion? [19:17; Heb.13:11-14; Acts 26:22-26](#)

To Golgotha, outside the camp. It was a very public place where everyone could observe.
