(16) The Tabernacle in Review

Heb 9:18-22

18 Therefore not even the first covenant was inaugurated without blood. 19 For when every commandment of the law had been declared by Moses to all the people, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, 20 saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that God commanded for you." 21 And in the same way he sprinkled with the blood both the tent and all the vessels used in worship. 22 Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. *ESV*

Heb 10:11-14

11 And every priest stands daily at his service, offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. 12 But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, 13 waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet. 14 For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified. *ESV*

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Seeing the Blood...Heb.9:18-22

Starting at the gate, identify the 'shadows' of the Blood/sacrifice of Christ. **Heb.10:1-14**
Silver/base, scarlet/gate, altar, laver, scarlet/door/ceiling/roof, tent/vessels, veil, mercy s.

Class Sharing: What has most impacted you from studying the Tabernacle?

Starting at the gate, identify the 'shadows' of the Deity of Christ. See **Phil.2:5-11**

Gold/boards/candlestick/altar of incense/ark/mercy seat/cherubim/utensils

Starting at the gate, identify the 'shadows' of the humanity of Christ. **Phil.2:5-11**

White linen in gate/fence/door/ceiling/veil. All of the '4's; roof/columns/tapestry/etc.

How do we see the *cross outlined* in the furniture of the tabernacle? **Law then grace, slide #5**

There are (7) pieces of furniture arranged in a cross figure. Foot outside, head inside!

How do we see the *steps of salvation* in the (4) roof coverings? **Slide #2-3**

1. leather (ordinary man) 2. Skins, red/blood 3. Goats/sacrifice/scape 4. 4 color tapestry

How do we see the steps of salvation from the fence to the Mercy Seat? **Slide #4-5**

1. Plain white fence 2. sacrifice/blood/altar 3. Laver/cleansing 4. Tabernacle/in Christ

The Old and the New...Heb.10:11-14

What does the writer of Hebrews emphasize about the *old vs new*? **Heb.10:11-12**

The old (Levitical) priest had to repeat sacrifices. Christ offered 1 sacrifice for all time!

Because of the new covenant (1Cor.11:25), what's our privilege? **Heb.10:19-25**

Enter the Holiest place w/confidence! Draw near w/full assurance of faith! Encourage...
