(10) HIS Immeasurable Power

## Eph.1:19-2:3 ESV (emphasis added)

1:19 *and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might*

20 *that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places,*

21 *far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.*

22 *And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church,*

23 *which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.*

2:1 *And you were dead in the trespasses and sins*

2 *in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience—*

3 *among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.*

### The immeasurable greatness of His power

To whom is His *immeasurable* power toward (for, to)? 1:19; Acts 1:8; Col. 1:9

**It's toward us who believe! That is those who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ!!**

What is emphasized again...and again? 1:19b, 1:17 *Comment??*

**The Father of glory works His great power. This work takes the Father's GREAT might!**

What specifically was this great power/might? 1:20, 3:20; Rom. 6:4-11

**When He raised Christ from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenlies!**

And where is the resurrection seating of Christ? 1:20-21; Ps. 110:1; Mt. 26:57-68

**Far above (over) all rule/authority/power/dominion/every name named, now and forever!!**

And what is the process and result of this authority of Christ? 1 Cor. 15:20-28; Heb. 2:5-9

**All saints are raised, Christ abolishes all rule/authority; gives all to Father, Himself (All)!**

What is so astounding about 2:6?? 1:3; Col. 2:12-15, 3:1-4

**We believers are now seated with Christ! We are His body / members, He is the Head!!**

And how does Paul *demonstrate* this truth? 1:22-23; 5:22-33; 1 Cor. 12:12-31

**He reminds us that the Church is the body of Christ! And we were raised / seated in Him.**

And what is the next sobering reminder? 2:1-2a; 1 Jn. 2:15-17

**You, now believers, were dead in your trespasses / sins, in which you once walked (lived).**
