What is Paul's urging here for the Ephesians? 4:1; Rom.12:1; IPet.2:11; Phil.1:27; Col.1:10 He wants them (us...) to walk (live our lives) in a manner worthy of your calling! What is the meaning of '...calling to which you have been called'? 4:1; Rev.17:14; Rom.1:6-7 This refers to a believer being chosen by God, before creation, to trust in Jesus alone. Why might Paul include '...a prisoner for the Lord'? 4:1, 3:1; Rev.6:9-11 Maybe gentle reminder that living for Christ can be hard. Not health, wealth, happiness! What does 'walking worthy...' look like? 4:2; James 4:6; Mt.5:3,5; Phil.2:7-8; Col.3:12 It is the hallmark of a Christian. Like Christ, gentle, humble, patient, loving one another. What are you to be eager to do? 4:3; Jn.13:34; ICor.1:10; IICor.13:11; Gal.5:22-23, never ends! It's more important to be at peace with others than "to be right"! Gentle, peaceful!! And why is this *commanded* of believers? 4:4, 2:15-16; ICor.12:12-13 There is (only) ONE body and ONE Spirit. Just as you were called to ONE hope. Unity!! What's his next reminder of why we should be eager to be unified? 4:5; Acts 4:12; Rom.10:12 All believers have ONE Lord, ONE faith, ONE baptism. Total unity, no divisions! And what is the next "One-ness"? 4:6; Deut.6:4; ICor.8:4-6: Gal.3:26-28; IJn.4:12-15 There is ONE God and Father of all Who is over all, through all and in all! Unity, all ONE
